## (Bomberos helping Bomberos)

The Rowan Fire Department has discovered a way to repurpose their outdated bunker gear and are spearheading a program to do so. Bomberos helping Bomberos is a group located in Dallas, TX and spearheaded by Pedro Arevalo. They gather expired fire gear by US Federal Standards and takes it to departments in Mexico and even as far south as Central America.

On Thursday, March 10 KCCI television came up from Des Moines and interviewed firefighters Joe West and Mark Pluff on how this project got off the ground and the broadcast aired on Friday, March 11 during the Morning Show and also the noon news.

Other area fire departments are being contacted to donate their old gear and everything will be driven to Dallas late March or early April. Currently it can all be hauled in a car but if donations keep coming in it may require renting a U-Haul to get it transported.

Donations for gas monay to help with expenses can be made to Rowan City Hall or dropped in the night deposit box in the library, Gas cards rather than cash donations are encouraged.

## From the Clerk's Corner.....

The Rowan City Council met on Monday, March 7, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. at the Community Center. Present at the meeting was Mayor Lennea Groom, Council Members Mark Bruns, Dale Hollman, Virgil Parks, Marcos Hurtado and Ashley Bosch and City Clerk, Aimee Miller.

During Public Input there was discussion regarding drain at corner of Bingham and Patton, property owner keeps building up the dirt/ lawn and it doesn't allow water to drain properly. The mayor will talk to owner. The full dumpsters at a property on Main Street were also discussed. It was approved to use Community Beautification Funds to have dumpsters hauled away and not returned unless approved by the city. Mark Thayer has been notified of the decision.


Groom opened the Public Hearing for FY 23 Budget. No public input. Public Hearing was closed. The Fiscal Year Budget for 23 was approved and it was approved to waive the 3rd reading of the budget.

It was brought to the attention of the council that the Janitor for the Community Center has not received a wage increase since being hired in 2007. The current salary is \$13.39/hour and it was approved to award a \$2.00/hr. increase.

Brandon and Kent Morten were present at the meeting and several issues with the septic system were discussed and some concerns clarified with the council. Council had been withholding payment of several bills until issues could be resolved. Those issues were agreed upon and the bills adjusted and approved as presented.

Dale Hollman presented the specifications for the repairs for the south side of the Community Center and also for the repairs that are required for the roof. These projects will be presented in two separate bids and will be due in city hall no later than 5:00 p.m. on on April 28, 2022. The notices will be published at the post office, on the city website and in several area papers.

The council has been discussing a Code Enforcement Officer for several months. The Wright County Sheriff's Department will no longer process code enforcement for the city. At our 1st Planning Meeting on March 21, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. Clarion City Manager, Clint Middleton and Wright County Economic Development Director, Darrell Steven Carlyle will attend the meeting to answer questions and make suggestions. The City of Clarion has hired a person to do code enforcement and has already entered into an agreement with the City of Dows to share that person. Rowan would like to determine if that would be feasible for our community too. Middleton had already shared with the mayor and city clerk that our ordinances would all need to be reviewed and updated to allow proper enforcement. The public is welcome to attend this meeting if they are interested.

## APRIL'S RECIPE OF THE MONTH: Amish Breakfast Casserole

## **Great for Easter Morning Breakfast**

Prep Time: 15 Min. Cook Time: 1 hr. Makes 15 Servings

1 lb. sliced bacon, diced
 1 med. Sweet onion, chopped
 1 1/2 C. small curd cottage cheese
 1 l/4 C. Swiss cheese, shreeded

6 large eggs, lightly beaten 1 lb. mild, bulk sausage
4 C. frozen hash browns, 1/2 red bell pepper diced
Shredded, thawed 1/2 green bell pepper diced
2 C. cheddar cheese, shredded fresh, snipped chives for garnish

- 1. In a large skillet, cook bacon and onion until bacon is crisp, drain.
- 2. Ina separate skillet cook sausage and bell peppers until sausage is cooked through
- 3. In a very large bowl combine the remaining ingredients, stir in bacon and sausage mixtures.
- 4. Transfer to a greased 13 in. x 9 in. x 2 in. baking dish. Bake uncovered at 350 degrees for 35-40 minutes or until set and bubbly. Let stand 10 minutes before serving.
