Cleanup Days in Rowan went very well and we are classifying the weekend as a success. It was a learning experience and there are things we will change in the future but all and all it went well.

You will be interested to know that approximately 3 tons of garbage was collected in the twp diumpters on Main Street and cost the city (taxpayers) \$426.40 to take to the landfill. Mark Thayer was able to collect 4500 pounds of recyclable metal around town so he was pleased with his day too. I know that some of you have items left on your curbs and that is because it was not items that Mark is able to pick up for recycle. Much of it should have gone in the dumpsters up town. Also, neither place was able to take TVs or computer monitors and that is something that we know for the future. We did find out that Buck Thompson's recycle in Belmond will take TVs and monitors so that would be a possibility if you have some to dispose of.

The hazardous waste collection on Monday evening from 4:00 to 6:00 p.m. was also successful. The Wright County Landfill was able to dispose of approximately 1700 pounds of hazardous waste for the community. One thousand pounds of that was latex paints.

I would just like to remind everyone that, although that was a good start, we still have work to do to clean up our great, little town. Garbage and recycle are available to everyone living in town. Garbage is picked up on a weekly basis on Tuesday. Recycle is picked up twice a month (the first & third Friday). Cont. on Page 6

### From the Clerk's Corner.....

The Rowan City Council met on Monday, May 2, 2022. Lennea Groom opened the meeting at 7:00 p..m. with 3 council members, Mark Bruns, Dale Hollman and Ashley Bosch present. Virgil Parks and Marcos Hurtado were both absent from the meeting. Minutes of both April meetings were approved and financials were approved as presented. Financial reports are available from the City Clerk upon request.

During public input Mayor Groom reported that she had been in contact with Site Services out of Algona regarding the old library and city hall building to look at asbestos abatement for the building. Site Services is going to present a bid to the city for the abatement and feel that the building would still qualify for DNR grants for demolition of the building once the asbestos is removed. They estimated the abatement to run approximately \$15,000 but will submit a formal bid for the project. Groom also reported that she thought it would be beneficial to provide a small dumpster by the west door of the Community Center for garbage. The current 55 gallon barrel on Main Street does not have a lid and garbage often blows out of the barrel. A 96 gallon dumpster can be rented for \$30 per month. The council approved the idea and T&S Sanitation will deliver the dumpster soon.

The Fire Department reported that the burn pile located on Bingham Ave. had been burned. A different truck has been purchased to be used as a township truck. No maintenance report was available.

The Public Hearing was opened for the FY 2022 Budget Amendment second hearing. No public was present. The motion was made to approve the Budget Amendment and a roll call vote resulted in unanimous approval. Mark Bruns moved to waive the 3rd reading, Bosch seconded and motion carried. The Public Hearing was closed.

A representative from Core and Main gave a presentation regarding a bid to upgrade water meters to a radio system. The was much discussion and many questions and answers and it was decided to ask for an updated quote to be presented at the June meeting.

Only one bid was received for mowing. The bid came from Tami Hollman for \$15/hour and gas and was accepted by the council. No bids had been submitted for the Community Center Roof project or the Community Center Siding Replacement project. It was decided to try to contact some area contractors and see if they would be willing to bid the jobs.

City-wide cleanup be be held the weekend of May 14 and 15 and Monday, May 16. A list will be compiled and distributed around town on what items can be delivered where and what items will not be accepted for pickup or dumpsters.

The landfill fees that are included in the monthly water bills pay for recycle. Yellow recycle barrels are available from city hall for \$10.00.

#### JUNE'S RECIPE OF THE MONTH: Rhubarb Dump Cake

4-5 C. Rhubarb, chopped 1 C. Water

1 C. White Sugar 1/3 C. Butter, melted

1 pkg. Yellow Cake Mix Cooking Spray

- 1. Preheat oven ot 350F. Spray a 9x13 pan with cooking spray
- 2. Add the rhubarb to the pan and spread out evenly on the bottom of the pan.
- 3. Sprinkle the sugar over the rhubarb. Follow by sprinkling the yeloow cake mix evenly over the sugar and rubarb.
- 4. Pour over the water and melted butter evenly. DO NOT MIX
- 5. Bake for 45 minutes until bubbling and the rhubarb is tender and the top is slightly browned.
