
Stories From the Library

The Fowler house is located at 135 Main Street in Rowan. The structure still stands but is in very poor repair and has not been inhabited for several years. Flo Fowler tapped flowing wells in the Rowan area.

From the Clerk's Corner.....

The Rowan City Council met on Monday, October 3rd at 7:00 p.m. with five Council Members, the Mayor and the City Clerk present. There was also one member of the public present at the meeting.

There was no public input at the meeting. Fire Chief Mark Bruns reported that the fire department has purchased nozzles with monies from the Barkema Trust and they were received and the department worked with them at the last meeting.

City Hall recently took advantage of a Surplus Sale at Simpson College and got a computer desk and two file cabinets free . Virgil Park made the trip to Indianapolis to pick up the furniture.

The Council approved to let bids for snow removal at the November 7th meeting and approved Trunk or Treat for October 29th at the Community Center from 4:00 to 6:30 p.m. They also approved the Fall Maintenance Contract for Sewer Filter Cleaning.

It was announced at this meeting that the city clerk has taken on a position with the city of Woolstock. She will be working in Woolstock on Fridays. She will continue to be City Clerk in Rowan, Alexander and Meservey.

The city is going to sell the John Deere 345 Lawn Mower and the C Farmall Tractor with a 6' Woods Mower Deck. There has not been a decision for sure when and how bids will be taken on these two items. The city has purchased a new Toro mower from Doug's Small Engine in Garner. Bids for mowing with the city's mower will be let in the Spring of 2023.

Rowan's Annual Tree Lighting and Soup Supper will be held on Saturday evening December 3rd. The city has also purchased 6 new Christmas decorations to go on the light poles on Main Street. Alliant Energy will be installing brackets and hanging the lights for the city as part of their community service. More details are located elsewhere in this issue.

There was considerable discussion about the the condition of the old library building. The mayor requested a motion for whatever needs to be done to put a fence around the front of the building to the outside edge of the parking area. Hollman made a motion, seconded by Park to do so. Bruns and Hollman will look into what it takes to construct.

During the council planning session in September council members reviewed multiple city ordinances and made changes recommended by the Sims and Corey to meet state codes. The council will review Chapter 155 which pertains to Building and Land Use Regulations. The council will also discuss any fine amounts throughout the codes that needs to be defined.

Other projects on the agenda included an Emergency Management Plan for Rowan which will be worked on over the next few months. The mayor will contact the contractor regarding the roof and siding on the community center. The council is also looking into lettering on the Fire Department and the Water Department and the abandonment of 121 Main Street. The paperwork for that petition on 121 Main Street has been turned over to the a new attorney.
