
Stories From the Library

From the Clerk's Corner.....

The Rowan City Council met Monday, August 1 at 7:00 p.m. at the Rowan Community Center with the Mayor and 3 council members present, Virgil Park, Dale Hollman, and Mark Bruns.

Mark reported that three members of the RFD attended grain bin rescue training at the Dows Fire Department. The Fire Chief reported that the truck that was going to be purchased has been returned to the previous owner. He will contact the administrator of the grant that was received to see if it is okay to use the funds to help purchase another piece of equipment that is needed. In the Maintenance Report it was reported that there is a leak in the northwest downstairs bathroom at the Events Center. Rusty Steenblock has been contacted to repair the leak. Also, a small sink hole on the north end of town was reported to City Hall. A pipe is visible in the hole. The Mayor will flag the hole for Maintenance to follow up on.

Jarika Eisentrager, Wright County Emergency Management, was in attendance. Discussed the previous Rowan plan and the current County plan. The Rowan Lions Club is sponsoring a project to purchase an automatic generator at the church. In Rowan's original plan the church was designated as the primary storm shelter in town. Jarika suggested that the city also look into purchase a generator for the Community Center that could then be designated as the Emergency Command Center if that is needed for the emergency. The council needs to set up a chain of command and a basic procedure for Emergency Management. Tornado sirens were also discussed. Rowan has not activated their warning siren for many years. Rowan is the only community in Wright County that does not have an automated siren that can be activated by the county com center. The dispatcher will be contacted to see what it would take to bring the town up to code. Jarika provided the mayor with several sample Emergency Management Plans from other small Iowa communities.

The mileage resolution was presented for the second time and once again failed due to lack of motion.

Discussion regarding lack of communication from both WC Sheriff and the City Attorney was discussed. Discussed other options for City attorney. The motion was made and carried to stop paying the contract amount to the Sheriff's department for a ode enforcement agreement that is not being followed.

The next Rowan City Council meeting will be held on Monday, September 5, 2022 at 7:00 p.m.

SEPTEMBER'S RECIPE OF THE MONTH: Cheesy Party Burgers

Football season is right around the corner and Cheesy Party Burgers are perfect for tailgating or a watch party.

Yield: 12 Burgers

1 pound lean ground beef

1 t. salt 1 t. pepper

1/ t. smoked paprika

Glaze:

1/ C. butter
2 T. brown sugar

1 T. Worcestershire sauce

2 C. Diced onion (about 1 whole onion)

3-4 cloves garlic, minced

1 10 oz. can Ro-Tel Diced Tomatoes & Green Chilies, drained

12 slices cheddar cheese

12 dinner rolls (I prefer Hawaiian rolls)

1 T. mustard powder

1 T. sesame seeds

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Coat 9x13 baking dish with non-stick cooking spray.

- 2. Brown beef and in a large skillet and season with salt, pepper, cumin, mustard powder, and paprika. Add the onion and garlic and cook stirring occasionally until beef is browned and ionas ae golden. Stir in drained tomatoes until well combined. Stir in drained tomatoes until well combined.
- 3. Place bottom half of buns in prepared pan. Top with beef and sliced cheese. Finish off with the top half of the buns.
- 4. Mix all the ingredients for the glaze in a sauce pan over medium heat until melted, smoth and combined. Pour over the buns.
- 5. Bake at 350 degrees F for 25 minutes.
