## Musings from the Mayor.....

Following the October 30th County Supervisor's Meeting in Clarion, both Lennea and Aimee Miller were approached by Eric Rector, Director of the Wright County Conservation Commission about funds available from that organization for demolishing the old library building. If we were to develop the empty lot into an outdoor classroom that could be used by the library, the Historical Museum and the Conservation Commission he was almost certain they would fund our project.

On Thursday, November 10th Lennea was notified that the Conservation Board had approved giving an interest free loan for \$42,000 over a 10 year period to the City of Rowan for the project. At the city council meeting on November 7, 2022 the Rowan City Council had approved to accept the Conservation Commissions offer if it was approved by their board.

On Monday, November 14th Site Services out of Algona began the abatement of the asbestos from the building and that portion of the project was completed on Tuesday, November 15th. The next step is demolition that is being completed by Mountain Movers. A ballpark date of November 28 has been scheduled but you may see equipment being moved into place as early as Thursday or Friday.

The total bids for the abatement and the demolition were



\$40,779.40. The asbestos abatement was bid at \$18,944.00 and the demolition at \$21,835.40. Additional asbestos was discovered during the abatement process which will add to the cost of that portion of the project but not significantly.

The other plus this month is that J & G Remodeling completed the siding repair on the south side of the Community Center and work on the Community Center roof is slated to begin after Thanksgiving.

## From the Clerk's Corner.....

The Rowan City Council met on Monday, November 7th at 7:00 p.m. at the Community Center with all five council members, the mayor and city clerk in attendance. There was no public input for the November meeting.

Mark Bruns reported that there has been one volunteer fireman resign due to health reasons. For the maintenance report Virgil Park reported that over and above regular duties he will be replacing a septic tank lid that had been damaged behind the west apartment buildings. There was also discussion about installing more security cameras in the Community Room of the Community Center.

Only one bid was received for snow removal and that was from Mountain Movers. A motion by Bruns and 2nd by Park was approved by the council. The Annual Tree Lighting on Main Street and Soup Supper in the Community Center will be held on Saturday, December 3rd beginning a little before 5:00 p.m. with the tree lighting. Alliant Energy will be contacted about getting brackets hung on the light poles and Riedel Tree Service will be contacted about getting the old lights off and the new lights on the tree.

The Mayor and Clerk presented at a County Supervisor meeting about getting funding through the county for the demolition and asbestos abatement of the old library. It was suggested that the city look into what interest rates are available from local banks first. Eric Rector approached them after the meeting and suggested he might be able to loan us the money over 10 years at 0% interest from a Wright County Conservation Reserve Fund if his board would approve it. He would like to see the space used as an outdoor classroom with native plants that his staff could use for educational purposes. The Council is in favor. The Council also approved the bid received from Mountain Movers for demolition after asbestos is abated.

The initial 14 radio read water meters have been received and the clerk is in the process of getting the software set up with the supplier. The second installment of the American Rescue Money allotted to Rowan has been received. That would be enough to purchase approximately 40 more meters. The council approved purchasing the meters that funds are available for.

In other business the council discussed fine amounts that are established in several of the city ordinances and also approved chapter 155 of the city ordinances. Those changes will be sent to the company working on the city's recodification. A building permit was approved for a chain link fence at 719 Duffy Street and the clerk has provided pictures and invoices to the city attorney for the 121 Main Street Abandonment.

## Change to School Bus Pick up and Drop off during Old Library Demolition!

For safety purposes the location of the bus pick up and drop off site will be temporarily changed beginning on Monday, November 28th until the demolition is completed. It should be no longer than two weeks at the most.

The bus will turn west on Broadway St to Ballou and then take Ballou to Main Street. It will turn left onto Bingham Ave and stop to pick up students. Vehicles can park on the west side of the playground to leave and pickup their students. Please do not park on Main Street during this time.



## DECEMBER'S RECIPE OF THE MONTH: Crockpot Corn Chowder

8 oz (1/2 lb) Bacon, cooked until crispy & crumbled
2 1/2 lb. potatoes, diced in 1/2 inch cubes
1/2 t seasoned salt
8 Cups kernel corn (I use frozen)
32 oz chicken stock
1 med/large yellow onion, finely chopped
1 Cup chopped celery
5-8 cloves of garlic, minced
1/2 t seasoned salt
32 oz chicken stock
16 oz half & half or heavy cream
Salt and Pepper to taste

- 1. Combine all ingredients EXCEPT half & half in the slow cooker.
- 2. Cook on low for 8-10 hours or high 4-6 hours
- 3. Blend about half the soup using an immersion blender or just scoop it into your upright blender then return to slow cooker
- 4. Add half and half or heavy cream and continue cooking uncovered for about another 15 minutes and heated through. Salt and pepper to taste.
