### Musings from the Mayor.....





## From the Clerk's Corner.....

The Rowan City Council met on Monday, December 5, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. at the Community Center with all members present.

Eric Rector, Director of the Wright County Conservation Board presented a check for \$41,000 for an outdoor learning space to the city council to help with the demolition of the old library and city hall. The money is an interest free 10-year loan from the conservation board. This is not tax payer money but from a reserve fund. A naturalist from the Wright County Conservation Commission works with the public libraries and this would be a good space for them to use for a class room. This fit right into the city's plan to make a green space in that area that could be used by the Museum and the Library and Community Center.

Mark Bruns reported that Mark Pluff has officially resigned from the Rowan Volunteer Fire Department. The Department is always looking for willing volunteers. Just contact Mark Bruns for more information.

Miss Loux reported to the council with an update for the food pantry and also a request. She reported that there has been a great response to the Rowan Food Pantry and that although they don't have an official number, they are estimating that approximately 80 people are being served. There has been a 9 member board established county-wide for the food pantry. Council person Marcos Hurtado is serving on that board. The community garden wasn't as fruitful and they hoped this year but they plan to do it again this year and will be making some changes. Loux was seeking permission from the council to replace the dorm size refrigerator in the pantry with a full-size one. She currently has access to yogurts, cheeses and meats but doesn't have the refrigerator capacity to accommodate those items. The council approved that request. The UCR Outreach Committee has been supplying milk and break on a weekly basis for the pantry and locals have been supplying eggs. Loux would also like to find a volunteer that would be willing to pick up tomatoes from Bushel Boys in Mason City so they would have the good tomatoes again this year.

Batteries have been purchased for the tractor and lawn mower and it is planned to have the new batteries installed and air in the tires of both by the March council meeting. The tractor and mower will be placed on an auction site after that meeting. The council also approved the purchase of two additional security cameras for the community center. These cameras will cover a wider area of the room and allow for monitoring activity in the entire room.
