From the Clerk's Corner.....

Mayor Lennea Groom opened the meeting at 7:00 PM. Council present- Mark Bruns, Dale Hollman, Heather Baumgartner, and Marcos Hurtado.

Minutes of the October meeting were approved with a motion by Hollman, 2nd by Hurtado. Approvedunanimously.

Public Input – Darrel Steven Carlyle reports that there have been 4 awards in Wright County from the Heart of

Iowa Program and one of them is in Rowan! Mayor spoke with Curtis about alley complaint, returned with list of complaints about Bruns. Mayor also spoke with Oliver and the property is being worked on and car has moved. Mayor inquires about fence repair at the church. Council asked questions about progress of new meter installations. There is a phone line hanging low in an alley, clerk will call Frontier.

Maintenance – Park absent. Hollman reports the backwash tanks are filling up faster than they should. He put the handicap parking sign back up at the Community Center.

Snow Bids – received one bid from Mountain Movers, motion by Bruns to approve, 2nd by Hollman. Approved.

Soup Supper/Tree Lighting – passed around soup sign up sheet, Mayor is in contact with Riedel to put lights up, clerk will call Alliant to put pole decorations up. Baumgartner would like to do the bake sale instead of the Historical Society with proceeds going to the new playground equipment – council agrees, we still have to come up with about \$3,000. Santa and Mrs. Claus will be here. Lions Club is doing treat bags and a hat and mitten drive.

Junk Cars – Mayor heard there was a new homeowner in town that only bought the property to store vehicles on that Dows is pressuring him to get rid of. There is nothing we can do proactively, if it does happen, will take steps necessary to have them removed. There are a couple of other properties in town that should receive notices for cars as well, will keep an eye on them.


Set January Meeting Date — clerk informs council that the January meeting date falls on January 1st and it might be better to move it with all of the guests we generally have at the January meeting. Motion by Hollman to move the meeting date to Thursday, January 4th at 7:00 PM, 2nd by Baumgartner. Approved.

CPR Classes – Loux and Meyer held a CPR class last week, but it was just too short of notice for anyone to attend. Mayor wonders if we should host one in conjunction with a Fire Department meeting. Bruns thinks that's a good idea, regular meetings are on the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays. Will make inquiries.

Housing – 2 properties on Pritchett may hold some interest to neighbors, one is not salvageable. Motion by Bruns, 2nd by Hurtado to have the clerk start the paperwork to work towards abandonment proceedings. Approved.



Bruns moves to adjourn. Adjourned.

DECEMBER'S RECIPE OF THE MONTH: Ginger Molasses Cookies

2 3/4 C. flour 2 t. ground ginger 1 t. cinnamon 1/4 t. ground cloves 1/4 t. ground nutmeg 1 t. baking soda 1/4 t. salt 3/4 C. butter softened 1 C. packed brown sugar 1 large egg 2 t. vanilla 1/3 C. molasses 1/3 C. white sugar

- 1. Sift together the flour, spices, baking soda and salt.
- 2. Beat together the butter and brown sugar until fluffy. Beat in molasses, vanilla & egg.
- 3. Turn down mixer and carefully beat in flour 1/2 at a time.
- 4. Cover bowl and refrigerate dough for at minimum 30 minutes
- 5. When ready to bake preheat oven to 350 degrees and line baking sheets with parchment paper. Pour white sugar in a bowl and roll dough into 1.5 inch balls. Roll in suger and place balls 2 inches apart on cookie sheets. Bake for 8-10 minutes and cool on cookie racks.
