Several years ago it was decided to hold the event on the Saturday closest to St. Patrick's Day and includes an Irish Stew lunch before the parade.



From the Clerk's Corner.....

Rowan City Council met twice in the month of January. Once on Monday, January 2 at 7:00 p.m. for the regular meeting and again on January 23 for a special meeting. During the regular meeting most discussion was based around the FY24 city budget. The Public Hearing for Max Levy of FY24 Property Taxes was set for Monday, February 6, 2023 at 7:00 p.m. during the regular council meeting.

Mayor Groom also appointed Councilman, Dale Hollman to the Wright County Landfill Commission Board. Also during this meeting Mayor Groom brought it to the attention of the council that employee compensation for the Rowan City Clerk and the Water Dept. staff was much lower than other surrounding communities of similar size. The council voted to increase the Water Superintendent salary to \$700 per month plus \$50 per meter for installation, increase Assistant Water Superintendent to \$150/month and the City Clerk to \$22/hr and an 8% increase to other city staff (Maintenance/Janitor).

During the special meeting on January 23 the council approved Resolution 2023-01 Support Heart of Iowa Trust Fund. Wright County Economic Director, Darrell Steven Carlyle was present to answer questions from council members prior to passing the Resolution. Other business during the meeting was a request from Carbon Solution Pipe Lines for bulk water access. No council member present was in favor of supporting this and the request was defeated unanimously. One council member was absent from the meeting.

Rowan City Countil met on February 6, 2023 for its regular meeting in February. Mayor Groom closed the regular meeting and opened the Public Hearing for FY24 Max Property Tax Levy. No public input and the Mayor closed the public hearing.

Katie Meyer, Library Board President, presented the Library Budget for FY24 and updated the council on library activities. Updates to staff and public computers is a priority of the new librarian and a firm from Clear Lake to help with the updating.

The FY24 budget was updated with Library, Fire and Emergency Management numbers. A public hearing for the budget has been set for Monday, March 6 at 7:00 p.m.

During an EMS/911 meeting attended by Mayor Groom late in January the EMS Commission Board voted to donate a generator being replaced by the Sheriff's Dept. to the City of Rowan. Several electric contractors will be contacted to submit bids for the installation of the generator at the United Church of Rowan for use in emergency situations for the city. P&P Electric in Webster City and DeBoer Electric in Latimer will be contacted to obtain bids.

During old business the selling of the city tractor and mower, the Community Center Roof, and lettering on the Fire Dept. and Water Dept. doors was tabled until this Spring. The hearing for the 121 Main Street abandonment is scheduled for February 15, 2023 at 11:00 a.m. The Mayor will attend.

The next City Council Meeting is March 6, 2023 at 7:00 p.m.
