The election will be held on Tuesday, November 7th and our voting location is the city hall in Belmond. You can also vote by mail in ballot or early voting at the Auditor's office in the court house in Clarion.

# From the Clerk's Corner.....

Mayor Lennea Groom opened the meeting on September 4th at 7:00 p.m. with all council members present.

The minutes or the previous meeting were read and approved. During the discussion of the financial vouchers Hollman wants to know if Debt Service Reserve can be put into a CD. the clerk will check with the Rural Development Office. Motion made by Hollman to approve all bills and pay an additional \$15,000 to our USDA Principal, 2nd by Baumgartner. Approved.

During public input council received a complaint about some chickens that are "free range", will find try to ind out who owns them. Council also received a complaint about someone who went into a citizens garden and poked holes in all of the pumpkins.

During the Maintenance Report Virgil reported that he had pulled out the refrigerator in the Community Center and cleaned good underneath and behind and was unable to find a leak. He fixed a tire on the mower, replaced the blades and cleaned off the deck. The blades were pretty worn for only 3 months use and maybe the deck should be raised a little. Bruns will look into some heavy-duty blades. Bruns and Hollman worked on leveling the leech fields down at the old ball diamond.

The Playground equipment purchase was briefly discussed. There was discussion about moving some of the old equipment to make adequate room for the new piece. Council will do some measuring and a decision will be made at the next meeting.

Several city alleys require some trimming before winter again this year. There was also discussion about trees on city property that need to be removed. Letters will be sent to property owners whose alleys need trimming and have other nuisance trees on city property.

Also discussed was a car that is being parked on a city street overnight on a daily basis. The mayor has the authority to ticket or tow but asks the council for approval to move forward with that. The vehicle owner has been emailed more than once. Motion by Hollman to authorize the mayor to ticket the car, 2nd by Bruns. Approved.

A resident has a sump pump and reflector going into an alley. The drain hose can withstand being driven over but the reflector needs to be removed. The owner needs to understand that the hose may be damaged during snow removal.

Halloween Trunk or Treat will be held on Tuesday, October 31st from 5:00 to 6:30 p.m. A free will meal will be served from 5:00 to 7;00 p.m and proceeds will go toward the Outdoor Classroom project.

No building permits were submitted.

The meeting was adjourned.

## Recipe of the Month.....Slow Cooker Nacho Soup

1 # Ground Beef, browned and drained
1 C. onions, chopped
1 C. green bell pepper, chopped
3 cloves garlic, minced
1 jalapeno, seeds removed, diced
15 oz. corn, drained
15 oz. black beans, drained & rinsed
15 oz. diced tomatoes, drain
Chopped green onions for garnish

1 1/2 t. chili powder
1 1/2 t. salt
1 t. black pepper
1/8 t. red pepper flakes
3 1/2 C. chicken or beef broth
8 oz. cheddar cheese shredded
1 C. heavy cream
3-4 T. AP flour

- To the bowl of a 5-6 qt. slow cooker bowl add beef, vegetables, beans, broth and seasonings. Stir gently to combine. Cover and cook on high for 4 hours.
- After 4 hours stir in cheese. Whisk together heavy cream and flour until smooth. Pour into slow cooker and stir to combine. Cover and continue cooking for 30 minutes.
- Serve warm with chopped onions and tortilla chips.

I recommend using the chicken broth for the version with beef. If you wanted to make it vegetarian soup, eliminate the ground beef and use the beef broth for flavoring or use vegetable broth.
